This qualification reflects the role of entry-level support workers who provide person-centred care to individuals with disabilities. Work may involve supporting clients in residential, community, or home care settings to enhance their independence and quality of life.

Students will develop essential skills to assist clients with daily living activities, implement individualised plans, and promote inclusion and empowerment.

DELIVERY

Online through our custom learning management system and participation in workplace-based learning with mandatory work placement hours.

DURATION

Flexible study options with enrolments being valid for up to 12 months.

Minimum **120 work placement hours*** is a requirement of this qualification.

*students must demonstrate all required skills in the work placement book to successfully complete the course. Student may require up to 150 hours of work placement if required.
