This qualification reflects the role of entry-level support workers who provide person-centred care to older people. Work may involve supporting clients in residential aged care, community, or home settings to enhance their independence, dignity, and quality of life. Students will develop essential skills to assist clients with daily living activities, implement individualised support plans, and promote wellbeing, inclusion, and respect for ageing individuals.

DURATION

Flexible study options with enrolments being valid for up to 12 months.

Minimum 120 work placement hours* is a requirement of this qualification.
